

Journal of a voyage in the Ship Montpelier from
his Bedford on a sealing voyage to the Indian
and Pacific Ocean

September the 22^d 1837

Commences with light wind from South
Employed in working the ship out of the Bay latter
part chased the Eskos and stowed them below their Eards

September the 23rd

Revises with light winds from S to steering S E
all hands employed in getting boats Middle
and latter part the same thus Eards

September the 24th

Begins with light winds from the westward
steering S E middle and latter much the same
sent out the 4th fore mast studding sail
thus Eards all hands employed in fitting the boats

September the 25th

Begins with light winds and variable steering
S E all hands employed in fitting the
Boats middle part wore main latter part fine
weather hitting in night

September the 26th

Begins with fine pleasant weather light winds
from the Northward steering S E all hands
employed in fitting the Boats Middle and
latter part the same thus Eards
