

September the 27<sup>th</sup>

Begins a strong breeze from S.W. steering E by S under double reef topsails at 8 P.M. took in all sail to close reef main top sail and luffed the wind ends fine weather all sail set

September the 28<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light winds from S.W. steering E by E all hands employed in filling boats and rigging middle part strong winds from S.E. concludes with a gale from S.W. with thunder and lightning and plenty of rain thus ends

September the 29<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong winds from S.E. with thunder and lightning and plenty of rain middle part more moderate concludes with a strong breeze steering E by E thus ends

September the 30<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong gale from S.W. steering E by E under double reef topsails and covers middle part much the same concludes more moderate turned the reef out of the topsails and set the main top galsails thus ends

October the 1<sup>st</sup> 1837

Begins with a fine breeze from S.W. steering E by E with all sail set all hands employed in ships duty middle and latter part the same thus ends

October the 2<sup>nd</sup>

Begins with a strong breeze from S.W. steering E by E with all sail set middle and latter part much the same thus ends

October the 3<sup>rd</sup>

Begins strong winds from S.W. steering E by E under double reef topsails concludes much the same thus ends the day

October the 4<sup>th</sup>

Begins with pleasant weather and a fine breeze from S.W. steering E by S covering all sails at 2 P.M. saw a Brig steering to the eastward latter part fine weather all hands employed in ships duty thus ends the day

October the 5<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fine weather and light winds from S.W. steering E by E at 6 P.M. saw a school of sperm whales going quick to the windward toward the boats and chased without success ends pleasant one sail in sight

October the 6<sup>th</sup>

Begins with a pleasant breeze from S.W. steering E by E at 6 made the island of Flores bearing E distance 80 miles; 3 sails in sight so ends

October the 7<sup>th</sup>

Begins pleasant with fine breezes from S.W. steering by the wind to the S.E. middle part the same at daylight made fine bearing E by S distance 15 leagues steering for the land two sails in sight

October the 8<sup>th</sup>

Begins light winds and calm steering into the land at 3 P.M. lowered the boats for practice at 4 luffed to the wind with the main yard a back at 4 o'clock for the land ends the same
