

October the 9th

Begins fine weather sailing in for the land at 3 P.M. the boat went on shore at Fajal middle part a strong breeze from N^o E. Under down the topsails and dunnage them ends more moderate one boat on shore 250 ends

October the 10th

Begins pleasant standing off and on at 1 P.M. the launch came along side with 150 bushels potatoes and 50 Onions, 700 eggs 50 pumpkins 2 Casks of wine 3 bushels of apples at 5 P.M. the Captain came off put up the helm and run out Steering S by W middle and latter part the same

October the 11th

Begins light winds and calm steering S by W at 11 took a strong breeze from N^o E ends much the same carrying all sail Nothing in sight

October the 12th

Begins strong gales from N^o E steering S by W with all sail set middle and latter part much the same Nothing in sight so on

October the 13th

Begins light winds from E steering S by W middle and latter part a dead calm all hands employed in Ships duty so ends

October the 14th

Begins a dead Calm middle & light breezes from N^o E steering S by W concludes much the same one sail in sight so ends

October the 15th

Begins with a light breeze from N^o E steering S by W middle and latter much the same one sail in sight all hands employed in Ships duty thus ends the day

October the 16th

Begins light N^o E winds steering S by W all hands employed in fitting rigging & Co middle and latter part squally with some rain one sail in sight thus ends the day

October the 17th

Begins strong winds from N^o E and squally steering S middle and latter much the same one sail in sight thus ends

October the 18th

Begins pleasant with a fine breeze from E by N steering S middle and latter part the same all hands employed in fitting rigging

October the 19th

Begins pleasant and a fine breeze from N^o E steering S two sails in sight middle and latter part the same thus ends Sat 20th

October the 20th

Begins fresh breezes from E steering S with all sail set studding sails below and a luff at 8 P.M. wind hauled E by S took in fly gill and lower studding sail and steered S by W at 11 made the Island of St Antonio bearing S by W distance 25 miles Calm and light winds and thick muggy so ends
