Wednesday 14th the preceding night
was very hot, squally and rainy
with thunder and lightning, but the
day was pleasant weather, the wind at
last we made our course E. and
by observation at 39. 57

Thursday 15th Remained pleasant weather
the wind at N. 10. we steer S. E. to day and
are by observation in Lat. 40-14 Long. 41-30

Friday 16th the wind and weather still
remained fair, we steer S. E. this day
but had no observation

Saturday 17th still Remained good weather
we steer E. by S. the wind Remained
at N. W. we steer E. by S. and want
by observation in Lat. 39-18 S. Long. 36. 0

Sunday 18th about three o'clock P.M.
we made the Isles flowery and about three
o'clock we went ashore and found the
inhabitation to be very rich and obliging
We purchased some sheep and one goat and
some unions ^{some poultry} and about three o'clock
P.M. took our departure, we saw likewise
about 20 miles E. by S. from the flowery
Islands are in Lat. 39-30 and 39-30 and
Long. 30 31.

Monday 19th Remained good weather
we steer E. by S. and sail hot and quick
and in the evening made S. George we
departed by leaving these Islands to the
S. and then bore away E. S. E. for
several days these Isles all day in Lat. 35.
about 20 miles S. Long. 28 to 29
