

Sept. 1785

Tuesday y^e. 20th we ran in with Teneriff
and went on Shoar and spent the greater
part of the Day with the Inhabitant who
treated us with great civility, we exchanged
A quantity of Rice for unions and about Sun.
Set took our Departure and steered S. by E.

Wednesday y^e. 21st at brake of Day we made
St. Michaels Right a head of us, and the wind
Blowing a very fresh at W. S. W. was oblig'd
to have away E. by S. in order to get clear
of the Islands and so pass by the E. End of it
and then made our Course S. the wind Rema-
ining at W. S. W. and blew very hard all Day
and towards Night we sprung our foretop sail
yard, this End this 24 hours all well on board

Thursday y^e. 22nd the ^{first} part of this 24 hours was
attended with Squalls of wind and Rain and
very Rough Sea, but the latter part it clear
off and was more pleasant, we still made
our Course S. No Ob. this Day

Friday y^e. 23rd was very good weather the
greater part of the Day, the wind at W. S. W.
We kept on our Course to the S. and were
By Ob. in Lat. 35. 3. and Long. 22. 0. W.

Saturday y^e. 24th the fore part of this 24 hours
was attended with high wind and Squalls of
Rain from the W. S. W. but the after part
was more pleasant, we made our Course S.
by E. and were by Ob. in Lat. 32. 56

Sept. 1785

Sunday y^e. 25th was pleasant weather the most
part of the Day the wind at W. S. W. and S. W. by W.
We made our Course S. S. E. and by Ob. in Lat. 31. 20

Monday y^e. 26th was extraordinary pleasant weather
and a moderate Breeze of wind at S. S. W. we
made our Course S. S. and were by Ob. in 30. 10

Tuesday y^e. 27th pleasant weather, but the wind
was light and variable, but finally towards the
latter part of the Day it shifted into the E.
and Remained there we still made our Course
to the S. and were by Ob. in 29. 47

Wednesday y^e. 28th pleasant weather and ^{at} brake of
Day we made the Canary Islands two of which
appeared plain in sight viz Palma and
Teneriff and soon after we saw Gomero, we
steer'd through between Palma and Teneriff
Leaving Palma to the west of us, and Teneriff
and Gomero to the East, and towards Night
we made Ferro to the S. and W. of us, these
Islands lay in Lat. 28. and odd & Long. 16. & 17. & odd

Thursday y^e. 29th good weather and a fine
Breeze of wind at N. E. about Ten o'clock
we found what they call a bone Shark
We saw the Liver only which made us
More than two barrels of oil, we steered S. S.
W. and were by Ob. in Lat. 26. 8

Friday y^e. 30th was pleasant weather, but
the wind was light and variable we steered
S. S. by S. and by Ob. in Lat. 24. 33.

Saturday y^e. 1st Day of October 1785
Was very pleasant weather and a small Breeze
of wind and variable we steered S. S. W.
and were by Ob. in Lat. 22. 22.
Nothing more remarkable this Day
