

Copy of a letter
 Pay to August 14th 1857

Dear Sir I have repeatedly received letters from
 my wife stating that you would not advance any money,
 and that you had sold the
 Oil to men (that failed) that we shipped home to men
 that failed and therefore you have money in your hand
 belong to me. I wish you to understand that I
 do not look for those you sell oil to for my pay
 but to you. I shipped for my proportionate part of
 the baggage. a portion of that has been shipped to
 you and you have received it, and to you I look
 for my pay. and you will find that law will
 give it to me. But put these things all aside,
 when I shipped ship.
