



Sept. 14 1848  
Remarks on board Ship Nauticon  
Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> These 24 hours commence with light  
winds from N W and pleasant weather all hands  
employed in fitting boats At 3 P.M. took in J.B.  
Sails At 9 double reefed Topsails Latter part  
strong gales laying too under close reefed No 1 sail

Friday 15<sup>th</sup> Commences with strong gales employed in  
sending down Royal yards and Masts Middle and  
Latter part strong gales

Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> These 24 hours commence with strong  
breeze and squally employed in fitting the boats  
Middle and Latter parts pleasant

Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> These 24 hours commence with strong winds  
and pleasant weather employed in fitting boats Middle  
part rainy reefed J. Sails Latter part squally mad sail

Monday 18<sup>th</sup> These 24 hours commence with strong breezes  
and squally Middle part double reefed Topsails  
Latter part strong breeze from S W steering E

Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> These 24 hours commence with strong breezes  
from S W steering E employed in fitting the boats  
Middle part rainy Latter part pleasant

Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> These 24 hours commence with light  
winds from ~~N~~ steering E by S employed in fitting  
the boats Middle and Latter parts light winds

Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> These 24 hours commence with light  
winds from E by S heading E employed in clearing  
up the hold at 3 P.M. took in J.B. sails at 7 double  
reefed Topsails Middle part moderate Latter part  
made all sail to ends

Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> These 24 hours commence with light
