Remarks on Board Sept 23^d 1848

First part a strong breeze from N^W at 4 P.M. weighed anchor set the topsails at sunset the light on the Sound Pige bearing per compass S^E by E 1/2 miles distant at 7 P.M. got the anchor stowed & all snug set the light sails & in the latter part a gale of wind at 10 P.M. took in the light sails at 3 A.M. reefed the topsails took in the main sail at 7 took in the B^E & waste boat to end ship under cloast reefed topsails steering a course S^E by E employed fitting boats &c
