Remarks on Board Ship "Norman" Wednesday
Feb. 11th First part, fine weather and light
breeze from the S.W. steering E by S. painted
the Starboard boat. Middle part, calm
latter part, the sun, put out the
Starboard boat, and took in the bow boat.

Lat. 36° 10' Long. 65° 48'

Thursday Feb. 12th First part, fine weather
and light breeze from the South, steering E. S. E.
painted the bow boat. Middle part, steering
East. Latter part, put out the bow
boat, and took in the Starboard boat.

Lat. 36° 20' Long. 65° 57'

Friday Feb. 13th First part, fine
weather and strong wind from the
S.W. steering E. S. E., employed painting
the Starboard boat. Middle part,
the wind hauled to the S.W.
latter part, fine weather and light
wind, put out the Starboard boat.

Lat. 35° 30' Long. 65° 34'

Saturday Feb. 14th First part, fine
weather and moderate wind from
the S.W. steering E by S. lowered our
boots for Blackfish and caught two.
Middle part, calm. Latter part, steering
by the wind, to the South.

Lat. 35° 10' Long. 65° 29'

Sunday Feb. 15th First part, fine weather
and strong winds from the West, steering
by the wind, to the North. Employed
hauling our Blackfish. Middle part,
moderate wind and. Latter part, calm.

Lat. 32° 30' Long. 65° 15'

Monday Feb. 16th First part, calm.
Middle part, calm. Latter part, the sun
put out the fore & mizen top sail.

Lat. 33° 7' Long. 65° 35'
