

Bained for the West Indies 1852

Journal of a whaling voyage made in the Brig Ocean of Sandwich in the Atlantic Ocean Commanded by J. Chadwick which commenced Feb 26 1852 and terminated Feb 16 1853

Thursday Feb 26th 1852
Begins with strong breezes from the West and clear at 8 AM the pilot came on board got underway and stood out of woods ^{Woods Hole} these remarks commence at 12 M & ends at 11 Mends and continues but no hours to commence Sea account

Friday Feb 27th
Begins with strong breezes from the West and fine weather at 2 PM discharged the pilot of course at 6 PM Warrant land bore E by S ditto 5 miles middle part light winds inclining southerly then South ends with fine weather all hands employed fitting the boat - So ends

Saturday Feb 28th Feb 28 50 Aug 2021
Begins with fine breezes from the North inclining easterly at 11 PM strong breezes from the East and thick weather took in the light sails at 12 M strong breezes from the South East and thick with clear kept the sails at 12 M increasing gale with rain bore to under fore top mast stay sail the lee clew of the main top sail & double keel top sail ends with heavy gales from the South East inclining southerly

Sunday Feb 29th
Begins with strong breezes from the SE with rain at 1 PM the wind hauled to the South West were they to the South & East and set the fore sail and fore keel top sail at 11 PM increasing gale took in the fore sail and fore top sail at 12 M hauled up the weather & lee of the main top sail at 2 PM heavy gale from the SE with heavy rain & lightning took in the fore top mast stay sail & top sail at 9 AM the wind NW put her up & down & under & lee keel main top sail & keel fore top sail ends with strong breeze & passing clouds Feb 29 50 Aug 2021
