

Tuesday, Nov. 15<sup>th</sup> 1882.

These 24 hours begin with strong breezes from N.W. West; at 12 P.M. weighed anchor and sailed for a whaling voyage in the Atlantic Ocean. at 6 P.M. dropped anchor in Sanpaulin Cove. The latter part moderate breezes from N.W. at 6 A.M. weighed anchor and proceeded to sea. at 12 noon are off Gay Head, steering about S. West. all hands employed in stowing anchors and cables.

Wednesday, Nov. 16<sup>th</sup>.

These 24 hours begin with moderate breezes from N.W. steering South by West; middle and latter part light breezes from S.W. northward steering the same westerly employed in rigging boats. saw a Steamer & Balling vessel.

All these 24 hours calm and light breezes from the N. West. steering S.W. by South. all hands employed in rigging boats.
