Whales 3

Friday June the 3rd 1870
First part of this day Pleasant breeze & good
weather the ship under all sail still employed
on ship duty in various duties Middle & latter
part pleasant weather so ended this day

Sat 39° 34' N
Long 58° 15' W

Saturday June the 4th
First part Pleasant weather the ship still under
all sail at one P.M. raised sperm whale 4 points
off lee beam Sawered 4 boats, S.B. boat
struck & saved one S.B. struck another a very
small one did not bring it along side At 4
P.M. hoisted on to cut & finished At 11 P.M. very
rugged sea on the wind from N.W. & so ended this
day no aly

Sunday June the 5th
First part Pleasant & fresh breeze all hands
employed on whale At 8 P.M. started the
works middle & latter part fine weather emp-
loyed. Bailing so ended the day Sat 39° 41' N
Long 56° 54' W

Monday June the 6th
First part fine Pleasant weather with Pleasant
breeze from N.W. At 4 A.M. collected dawn
middle & latter part calm so ended this day
Lat 39° 41' N - Long 56° 54' W
Sawered 2 boats
Long 55° 35' W

Tuesday June the 7th
First part very fine weather At 1 P.M. lowered
P & M boat for same kind of whale 4 miles
off on weather beam & pulled up there but saw
nothing returned to the ship at 4 P.M. at 6 P.M. saw
whales ahead about 1 mile Sawered P & M boats
so ended this day no aly
