Steering towards the Cape De Verd Islands January 1847

January 24 1847

Remarks Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> 1847

First part strong gales from the Westward course set  
by East and double reef fore and aft at 11 AM  
in the fore and main course.

Middle part wind shifted to the Northward turned  
the reef out fore and aft and set the top gallant  
sails

Latter part gentle breeze and fine pleasant weather  
course S by East at 10 PM saw a sail standing  
to the N East by the wind the Ende all hands employed  
in preparing the Sabath

Lat 33° 55' S Long 27° 47' West

Remarks Sun Monday 25<sup>th</sup> 1847

First part of these 24 hours light air and calm  
at 4 PM took out the main hatch for Bread

Middle part light air from the South  
steering sharp by heading South East

Latter part fine pleasant weather and calm  
all hands on duty save the coopers most  
employed in setting up rigging getting boats  
saw a ship standing to the N East

by Ende Lat 33° 14' Long 27° 44' West

Remarks Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> 1847

First part of these 24 hours calm at 4 PM  
took out the main hatch for Bread

Middle part gentle breeze from the South West  
course South all sails out at daylight saw a  
stranger sail to the Westward of us.

Latter part gentle breeze steering sharp by heading  
South all hands employed in preparing the Sabath

Lat 32° 56' S Long 27° 00' West
