

Remarks on Board of Bark Pacific J. W. Allen

Wednesday August 9th 1835

Commenced calm heading to the Eastward. Middle and latter part light breezes from the Westward steering N. N. E. Nothing in sight worthy of remark. Employed variously. To 2 o'clock
Lat Obs 40.10 N Long by Chron 42.57 W

Thursday Augth 10th

Continues light breezes from N. W. steering N. E. by E. Middle part steering E. S. E. Latter part moderate breeze from N. W. steering N. E. by E. Saw Grampuses 2 sails etc. To 2 o'clock this day
Lat Obs 40.26 N

Friday Augth 11th

Moderate breezes from N. W. steering N. E. by E. fine pleasant weather - no Whales Middle and latter part light airy and calm heading all round the compass. Watches employed in ship's duty
Lat Obs 41.11 N

Saturday August 12th

Still continues calm Middle part the same Latter part moderate breezes from the Westward steering N. N. E. Nothing in sight and no likely prospect of obtaining any thing
Lat Obs 42.18 N Long by Chron 38.22 W

Sunday August 13th

Continues moderate breeze from the Westward steering N. N. E. Saw Blackfish however but it was no good catch. Middle part took in all sail but fore and aft sails. Latter part fine weather steering to the Eastward Nothing in sight.

The Pacific is very much in want of a Whale or two. I mention it to the Captain or Whaler.

It is almost enough to make one discouraged but the Capt says 10 months more will bring us to New Bedford. I hope so.

Monday August 14th 1835

These 24 hours fine weather and gentle breezes from the Westward steering various courses S. E. N. E. and East. Saw 5 or 6 Grampuses

Tuesday Augth 15th

Strong breezes and fogged from the S. W. 1.31 Spoke Ship Wood Gills. Finning of Ch. 13 Clean. Thick dirty rainy weather Middle part thick weather heading S. by E. Under short sail Latter part steering from S. W. steering S. E. Saw Grampuses and 5 Sails etc. Spoke Bark Louisa a cargo of New Bedford. Clean sailed the same day we did has seen 4 Whales 8 times etc.

Wednesday Augth 15th

Continues moderate breeze from S. W. and Smoother steering S. E. Middle and latter part fresh breezes from S. W. and Smoother weather steering by the wind to E. by E. and S. E. 1 Ship in sight. Watches employed in various jobs about the rigging
Lat Obs 41.07 N Long by Chron 29.58 W

Thursday Augth 17th

Fresh breezes to begin this day from S. W. and Smoother weather steering S. by E. Middle part heading to the N. N. W. Latter part fresh breezes from S. W. heading to the S. by E. Saw Grampuses and 5 Sails
Lat Obs 40.00 N Long by Chron 29.10 E

Friday Augth 18th

Continues fresh breezes from S. W. and Smoother weather steering by the wind to the S. by E. at 6.30 Saw the Islands of Natal. Pico & St George bearing S. by W. Distance 40 miles. Fresh breezes through the night heading variously. Latter part saw Grampuses and the above mentioned Islands. Wind S. W. heading S. by E. and S. E. by the wind. Saw Greaves and 10 or 12 Sea and passed close to it. To 2 o'clock
