

Remarks On Board of Bark Pacific J. R. Allen

Saturday August 19th 1835

Commenced fresh breezes from S.W.
 Steering S.E. Saw the Island of Piceira ahead. Lowered
 boat for a Grampus (no catch) at 7 P.M. Luffed
 by the wind under short sail. Tacked ship through the
 night at daylight kept off for the Island of Piceira and
 steered for it the rest of this day. Light air with thick and
 rainy weather. Saw Grampus and one sail.

No Obs.

Sunday Augth 20th

Continued light breezy steering along
 land about 5 miles distant. 3 P.M. Sent a boat on shore
 6.30 returned with a few Potatoes and onions and
 ascertained we can get a Plantain. Lying off and on

Monday Augth 21st

Light air and calm had a Gam
 with Ship James Arnold Cleveland 800 bbls Oil
 and Bark Sea Fox. Allen 600 bbls S.O. of N.B. Middle
 part light breezy. 8 AM Capt^s went on shore. Ends
 Light breezy and showers of rain. the boat on shore

Tuesday Augth 22nd

Continued Light air and thick
 drizzly weather took on board Potatoes & Onions. at
 Quiting the night we worked the ship to Fayall
 8 AM Capt^s went on shore. at Meridian not returned

Wednesday August 23rd

This day Lying off and on
 at Fayall and I was discharged and went
 on shore at the Hospital. and from this time
 to the 29 I remained in Fayall when I left in the
 Big Sea Foam. Capt. Plimney of Boston for
