

Remarks and occurrences on board the
Ship Orion, on a Whaling Voyage from
Nantucket to the Pacific Ocean by
Shadrach Freeman junr. Master
Commenced October 7th 1829

Oct 7th sea account, at 5 A.M. got under
way from the cove, and proceeded to sea
with the wind at west, at 9 A.M. dischar-
-ged the pilot. End with pleasant weather

Thursday Oct 8th First part pleasant
weather. At 10 past Mer. Saman's land bear
East, steered S.E. Middle part light breezes
At 2 P.M. wind veered to North, steered E.S.E.
 Latter part, wind veered to the N.E. Ends with
strong breezes in the N.E. Lat 39:45 Long 67:13

Friday Oct 9th
All these 24 hours fresh breezes from N.E. to East
with cloudy ^{weather} latitude by Obs 38:34 Long 67:31 West

Saturday Oct 10th
All these 24 hours moderate breezes with a high
short swell, wind variable from E.S.E. to E.S.E.
Latitude by Obs 37:38 Long 66:59

Sunday Oct 11th
All these 24 hours light wind and variable
from N.E. to S.E. steering on different tacks.
Latitude by Obs 37:39 Long 66:30 West

Monday Oct 12th
All these 24 hours fine breezes from E.S.E. to S.E.
with pleasant weather, steering by the wind to
the Eastward. Latitude by Obs 39:00 Long 66:55

Tuesday Oct 13th
First part fair weather wind southerly. Middle
part strong breezes, weather fair. Latter part
moderate wind ^{veering} westerly, set a fore topmast
steering: mil. Latitude by Obs 38:57 Long 66:52 West
