Journal of a voyage in the ship
Pacific of Fairhaven Cap. Rufus Hunt
of New Town.

Monday Feb 17th 1851. This day at 10 AM
the Pilot and some of the crew came on
board with my self to get the ship
ready for sea. Noon the rest of the men
got on board & 2 PM the Capt & Mate on
board got under way got on to the Fort Flat
cloud down just as sails haul'd off and came
to anchor where we started from. Lat 46

Tuesday 18th Strong breeze from S.W. Later part
P.M.

Wednesday 19th Wind N.W. & A.M. the Pilot came
on board got under way and stood to sea
& noon the Pilot left. Lat 46

Thursday 20th First part light winds and pleasant
Middle and later part the same
Lat 40.12 N Long 74.04

Friday 21st All these 24 hours strong breezes
Equally with thunder and rain from S.W.
Lat 39.41 N Long 69.30.

Saturday 22nd All these 24 hours fresh breezes with a
heavy S.W. swell Lat 39.3 Long 68.78

Sunday 23rd All these 24 hours fresh breezes from
S.W. to N. steering S.E. Lat 37.58 N Long 65.52 W.

Monday 24th First part of these 24 hours light
breezes & N. steering S.E. Middle part the same
Later part employed fitting boats and breaking
out. Lat Long
