

Ship Pacific Outward Bound 1851.

7 Sunday Feb 25th Commenced with light breeze and pleasant steering S. by E. Middle part Strong breeze from S. W. Latter part Strong Gale with heavy rain squalls laying to sea and spruces and fore top-mast stay still & 11 A.M. the ship drifted to N. W.
 Noon Lat 35 24. Long 62 55

8 Wednesday 26th All these 24 hours strong gale with very heavy squalls & 6 A.M. ship a heavy sea on the starboard bow and stove the mainmast to pieces on the cranes turned up lost, had to load the spar
 Lat 34 40 Long 61

9 Thursday 27th All these 24 hours strong gale from N. W. to N. E. & 4 A.M. lost the fore top boom by the ship pitching she went in to a heavy sea and buried her fore boom all under water, shot down the main royal yard & 8 wore ship head to the Eastward
 Lat 33 57. Lon 61 30

10 Friday 28th All these 24 hours moderate breeze & N. W. heading E. S. E. Spotted a schooner bound to New York
 Noon Lat 33 30 Long 60 30 1/2

11 Saturday ~~29th~~ All these 24 hours moderate and pleasant nothing in sight employ^d breaking out for small stores and water. steering S. E.
 Lat 32 55. Long 58 36 1/2

12 Sunday March 1st All these 24 hours light breeze and pleasant from West steering E. all hands at leisure exchange signals with a Spanish Bark.
 31-52. Long 57 41 1/2

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13 Monday March 3rd Commenced with pleasant breeze from the Westward steering to the East employed fitting the boats for whaling loads. Noon Lat 32 54 N. Long 54 03 1/2

14 Tuesday March 4th Commenced with pleasant weather and light breeze from the Westward steering East employed setting up rigging so was. Lat 31 56. Lon 54 4

15 Wednesday March 5th Commenced with strong breeze from E. closed reef the top sails Middle & latter part the same Noon Lat 31 38 Long

16 Thursday March 6th Commenced with strong breeze & E. a cloudy heading S. E. Middle & latter part the same Noon Lat 30 32. Long 52 35

17 Friday March 7th Commenced with moderate breeze from E. S. E. passed a bark steering N. W. W. back ship to the N. Middle & latter part the same
 Noon 31 31 N Lon 52 14

18 Saturday March 8th Commenced with light breeze from S. E. heading N. Middle part the same latter part made all sail Noon Lat 33 07. Long 52 56

19 Sunday March 9th Commenced with light breeze from N. E. to E. N. E. Middle part calm Light latter part light air from the West all hands at leisure
 Noon Lat 32 31 N Long 51 54 1/2

20 Monday March 10th Commenced with light breeze and pleasant weather steering E. nothing in sight
 Noon Lat 33 12 N Long 50 42 1/2

21 Tuesday March 11th Commenced with light breeze and fine weather steering E.
 Noon Lat 33 33 N Long 48 10 1/2
