so ends this day

Thursday July the 12th 1894 Days out 606
this day I gail ended and it better commened
from the same quarter steard to the E & S
under a heavy breeze of sail with it heavy
see on the watch implaid it was a little
And they have a nut to put
so ends this day Satt 2110 Long 166 11 55

Friday July the 13th 1894 Days out 607
this day it heavy gail with it heavy see
from the N^W & W it steard with thunder
lighting and rain steard to the E & S under
short sail the watch implaid it was a little
making and taking in sail stid so forth
so ends this day Satt 21 30 Long 162 11 40

Saturday July the 14th 1894 Days out 608
this day part and shiel part strong winds
and a heavy see it steard with squally
rain thunder and lightning steard to the E & S
the later part more moderate it N & W
Main sail so ends this day

Sunday July the 15th 1894 Days out 609
this day pleasant weather it N & W main
all sail the watch implaid it staving
down the rizer so ends this day

Monday July the 16th 1894 Days out 610
this day moderate breeze and moderate
steard to the E under all sail
so ends this day

Tuesday July the 17th 1894 Days out 611
this day squally weather and moderate winds
with rain some steard E it N & W it steard
change of wind from N & W to S & W the watch
implaid it spitting the rizer some see
pink hach so ends this day

Wednesday July the 18th 1894 Days out 612
this day pleasant weather winds from the
N & W steard to the E & S under all sail
all hands implaid it staving down oil
so ends this day

Thursday July the 19th 1894 Days out 613
this day the winds were strong steard
to the N & W steard to the Eastward under it
power of sail the watch it fitting the
saw some small pink hach
so ends this day

Friday July the 20th 1894 Days out 614
this day a gail from the N & W steard to the
N & W it steard to the N & W under all sail
to it least main top sail it N & W it steard
the N & W it steard to the N & W under all
sail the wind build the watch implaid
it came a little so ends this day Satt 21 39

Saturday July the 21st 1894 Days out 615
this day pleasant weather and light winds from the
N & W steard to the N under all sail the watch
implaid it ware he felt fitting ship
so ends this day 18 42

Sunday July the 22nd 1894 Days out 616
this day burst part it moderate winds from the
N & W steard to the E & S under all sail the later
part light winds it N & W the N & W
have N & W it steard to the N & W under all sail
and lead it N & W so ends this day
