First and middle parts strong winds from
the N.E. and Cloudy. Latter part fine
breezes and pleasant. Course S.W. by N.
employed at painting. Lat by Ob. 26.46. N
Long. Chr. 65.54 -

Tuesday 13th
First part fine breezes from the N.E. and
pleasant, middle and latter parts light
winds from S.E. Course N.W. by N. employed
at painting outside. Saw a Brig the Captain
went on board of one the Union of Philadelphia
7 days out. Lat by Ob. 28. 18. N
300 miles to Bt. Long. Chr. 66. 58. W

Wednesday 14th
All this day light winds from the
Eastward and fine weather. Course N.W.
employed at painting outside. Saw a
Brig standing to the N.E.
Lat by Ob. 29. 09. N
Long. Chr. 67. 26

Thursday 15th
First and middle parts light air from
the S.E. Latter part fine breezes from the
South and pleasant. Course N.E. by N.
Saw a ship standing to the N.E.
Lat by Ob. 30. 17. N
Long. Chr. 68. 05. W

Friday 16th
First part light breezes from the
South and pleasant, middle and latter
part strong breezes and Cloudy. Course
N.W. Saw a ship and a Brig.
Lat by Ob. 35. 50. N
Long. Chr. 69. 10. W
