

Remarks On board of Bark Pioneer ^{Master} A. W. Hocking

Remarks On board Tuesday June 27th 1847

First part moderate breezes from NW clear

Middle part cloudy

Later part moderate breezes from S.W. W. at 8 P.M. took the anchor & made sail for sea with pilot on board bound to sea from Salt Bedford - ends with light breezes employing standing anchor & beating out the harbor

Remarks On board Wednesday June 30th 1847

First part these 24 hours commences with moderate breezes from N.E. at 3 A.M. winds shifted to S.W. exposed yards steering N.W. at 11 P.M. put pilot sail winds shifted to N.E. with moderate breezes. Stowed anchors and hove to chains put them below & lay bearing East 1/2 miles Dist from which we take our departure at 11 P.M. observations set with steering N by E.

Middle part fresh breeze with on top of main sails steering N E by E.

Later part moderate several sails in sight thick & rainy people employ a better heat this cross great hauls sail
