Remarks Onboard Monday July 29th 1847

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from E. heading N by E severe rain at 7 P.M. both in courses & fore & aft sail all kept under main to heading N by E with a severe gale from S.E.

middle part strong gusts & tremendous sea running at 6 P.M. set double reef topsails at 8 P.M. shook out reef here up 3/4 winds N.E. cloudy

ends with strong breezes & cloudy

Long at 11 P.M. 61 22 Lat by 38 41 N

Remarks Onboard Tuesday July 30th 1847

These 24 hours commences with strong S.E. winds & cloudy steering S.E. all prudent sail set saw 3 whales source one had with one success people employed at fitting for whaling at dusk single reef the topsails

middle part more moderate & P.M. made all reef winds haul to N.W. steering East

latter part the same having clouds people employed fitting for whaling

Long 67 20 Lat by 38 37 2 N

Remarks Onboard Wednesday July 31st 1847

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from N by W all sail set steering East people employed at sundry jobs at 4 P.M. took in 1/2 gaff top sail set up rigging & the Pelagos by squalls

middle part the same at daylight 1/2 sail in sight

ends with fine weather & fresh breeze all sail set steering E by S. winds S.W.

Long 62 30 M Lat by 38 09 N

Richard W. Hathaway Master Bound On a Whaling Voyage

Remarks Onboard Monday July 5th 1847 to the South sea

These 24 hours commences with fresh breeze from south passing seas all sail set steering E by S & lowered sails in sight

middle part moderate & pleasant steering East winds S.W.

latter part calm employd setting up rigging & carrying other jobs 7th Lunar Observation

Long 59 Lat 61 22 Lat Long per chron 61 36 Lat 57 56 by 3

Remarks Onboard Tuesday July 6th 1847

These 24 hours commences with calm & pleasant employd setting up rigging at 3 P.M. light breezes from S.W. steering East

middle part the same

latter part very pleasant light airs & sail in sight at 7 P.M. hauled 1/2 top & lay along side caught 1/2 fish people employd setting rigging & fitting for whaling

took 2 Land 13

Long per chron 60 35 Lat by 37 15

Remarks Onboard Wednesday July 7th 1847

These 24 hours commences with moderate breezes from N.W. & pleasant all sail set steering E by S. hauled 1/2 sea & water

middle part the same

latter part light baffling winds course & had broke and water & cheese employd fitting cutting & one sail in sight caught a mess of fish
