Saturday June 26<sup>th</sup> 1858  
*Breezy,* haul. with a strong breeze from the  
S. S. W. and cloudy weather, steering by  
the wind to the S. E. under topsails  
courses &c. at 9. P. M. shortened sail, at  
daylight made all sail. saw two sails.  
*Moderate,* latter part moderate wind from the S. by W.  
and pleasant, the watch employed in  
various jobs. So Ends. Lat 37. 01. N. Long 61. 03. 45 W.

*Brisk Wind,* Sunday June 27<sup>th</sup> 1858  
haul. with brisk wind from the S. by W  
under all sail by the wind to the S. E. & E  
at sunset shortened sail, middle part  
moderate, at daylight made all sails. saw  
three sails. So Ends. Lat by Obs. 35. 55. S. Long 58. 02 W.

*Light Wind* Monday June 28<sup>th</sup> 1858  
haul. with light wind from the S. S. W to  
S. W. steering by the wind to the S. E. and  
S. S. E. under all sail. at sunset shortened  
sail, at daylight made all sail, steering S. E.  
saw three sails. the watch employed in  
various jobs. So Ends. Lat 34. 25. N. Long 56. 38. W.

*Squally,* Tuesday June 29<sup>th</sup> 1858  
haul. with brisk winds from the S. W. with  
passing squalls of fine rain, steering S. E.  
with all sail set, at 9. P. M. took in the light  
sails, lashed up the spare spars &c. at sunset  
took in sail, and luffed by the wind to  
the S. S. E. at daylight made all sail  
and steered S. E. by E. saw nothing. So Ends.  
Lat by Obs. 33. 05. N. Long by Obs. 53. 45 W.

*Scraped Decks* Wednesday June 30<sup>th</sup> 1858  
haul. with brisk winds from the S. W. and  
clear weather, steering S. S. E. under all sail.  
at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made  
sail, steered S. S. E. the watch scraping decks &c.  
latter part breezy, so Ends. Lat 32. 29. N. Long 51. 50. W.

the Western Islands, Augustus N. Perkins, Master.  
Thursday July 1<sup>st</sup> 1858  
*Breezy,* haul. with a brisk breeze from the S. W.  
and cloudy weather, steering East under  
moderate sail, at 9. P. M. double reefed the  
top sails, middle part light showers of  
rain, at sunrise made sail, saw three  
sails, steered E. N. E. with a strong breeze.  
So Ends. Lat by Obs. 32. 54. N. Long 48. 43. W.

*Breezy,* Friday July 2<sup>d</sup> 1858  
haul. with a strong breeze from the  
S. W. by W. steered E. N. E. with Main S. G. Sail  
out, saw a merchant Bark steering N. E.  
at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made  
sail, the watch employed in various  
jobs. had some light showers. So Ends.  
Lat by Obs 34. 37. N. Long by Obs. 47. 00. W.

*Rainey,* Saturday July 3<sup>d</sup> 1858  
haul. with light baffling winds from S. W  
to N. W. with rain squalls, at 4. P. M. the  
wind S. W. by W. steered E. N. E. under moderate  
sail, middle and latter parts strong breeze  
and rugged. So Ends. Lat by Obs 36. 35. N. Long 43. 38. W.

*Breezy,* Sunday July 4<sup>th</sup> 1858  
haul. with a strong breeze from the S. S. W  
and rugged, steering E. N. E. under courses.  
Sibb and top sails, middle and latter parts  
rugged the wind S. E. by E. steering E. N. E.  
under short sail, saw lots of Finbacks.  
So Ends. Lat by Obs. 38. 39. N. Long 41. 34 W.

*Finbacks,* Monday July 5<sup>th</sup> 1858  
haul. with a strong breeze from the S. S. E  
and rugged, steering by the wind to the  
E. N. E. saw Finbacks. middle and latter  
parts moderate so Ends. Lat 39. 32. N.  
Long by Obs. 40. 04. W.
