11 Tuesday These 24 hours commences  
with moderate winds with rain  
at 10 pm took our anchor from  
Clerkes point and stood out  
in company with the Gayhead  
still a raining and a blowing  
on from the N.E. at 3

12 Wednesday These 24 hours commences  
with strong winds with rain  
at 3 am discharged our pilot  
steered of S.W. employed in  
securing the anchors at 7 steered  
S.E. the Gayhead out of sight  
middle and latter part fine  
Lat 39.00 Long 69.30

13 Thursday These 24 hours  
commences with light winds  
from the S with rain latter  
part the same employed in breaking  
Cright in the four hole so ends  
Lat 39.05 Long 68.10

14 Friday These 24 hours commences  
light winds from the S a bedding  
to the E at 7 am more wind with  
rain middle part strong winds  
doubled reefed a steering E.S.E.  
latter part more moderate set sail  
Lat 39.29 Long 67.00

15 Saturday These 24 hours commences  
with strong winds from the N.E.  
a steering S.E. middle part more  
moderate and clear latter part fine  
employed in various jobs about  
the ship so ends  
Lat 38.38 Long 66.50

Sunday 16 These 24 hours commences  
16 with moderate winds from the E a  
bedding the S middle part more wind  
with rain took in light sail and doubled  
reefed the topsails and hauled the gib and  
all in sail latter part clear set some sail

17 Monday These 24 hours commences  
with strong winds from the S.W. a steering  
E by S middle part clear latter part  
employed in fitting the boats so ends  
Lat 38.30 Long 62.00

18 Tuesday 18 These 24 hours commences  
with strong winds from the S.W. a  
steering E by S at 6 am saw a whale  
of our lee run for him but saw nothing  
at 11 am down took in sail and hauled  
sharp by to the S latter part strong winds  
a steering E.S.E. so ends

19 Wednesday 19 These 24 hours commences  
with strong winds a steering E by S  
winds from the S.W. stove the bow  
boat on the cranes by a sea middle  
part strong winds latter part the same  
employed in various jobs about the  
ship so ends all is well  
Lat 38.40

20 Thursday 20 These 24 hours strong  
winds from the S.W. a steering  
E.S.E. middle part more moderate  
set some sail latter part fine  
employed in ships duty  
Lat 37.47 Long 63.10
