part strong winds at day light  
commenced to hear over board  
the try works latter part more  
moderate set all sail saw a  
number of seal. no ends

Tuesday 5 Shore of hours  
commences with moderate  
winds from the W & steering  
N N W at 6 p.m. entered green  
water at 9 am sounded no bottom  
at 10 fathoms of line middle part  
squally latter part fine winds more  
to the W no ends

Wednesday 6 Shore of hours  
commences with fine winds from  
the S W a strong N by W at 4 p.m.  
spoke a new York pilot boat  
Egg harbor a bearing W dist 9.5 miles  
middle part winds light spoke  
No 4 pilot boat of New York  
latter part winds light and baffling  
spoke No 9 pilot boat of N York  
saw a number of seal  
Martha dist 30 miles
