

Passage from Nantucket Bar to 7th August
August the 5th 1836
first part strong breezes from S at 4 P.M.
lowered and struck along whale and killed at 11
P.M. got him along side at 6 P.M. called all hands
and began to cut at 12 finished cutting of the
head and gave Lat. Sound.

Thursday first part light air from Sward heading
to the Eward employed in cutting in 5 P.M.
finished cutting in and began to get ready for
boiling at 10 made a fire middle and later
strong breezes employed in boiling men's

Friday Lat. Sound
first part strong breezes from the Southern
heading to the eastward at 5 P.M. tacked W.
and at 7 double reefed the topsails middle and
latter employed in boiling wind S heading
S.S.W. Lat. Sound

Saturday first part strong breezes S heading
at 4 P.M. tacked to the S.E. at 8 P.M.
finished boiling and cleared up deck latter
part squally wind S.W. by S course S.E. by S

Sunday Lat 40 55 Long
first part squally all hands employed in
crabbing deck middle part squally at 10 wind
billed N.W. by W course S.W. at 3 P.M.
hauled up E.W. E latter part squally

Monday mid Lat 39 00 Long 38 32
10 first part light winds N.E. heading S.E.
mainsail steering to the westward middle
part the same latter part moderate at 5
P.M. saw the Island of Flores bearing
S.E. by E distance by estimation 45 miles
so ends
Lat 39 00 Long

Off the Azores Islands August 10th 1835
Wednesday Tuesday 11

first part light air Ely 11 steering S.E. in water
employed in narrow ribs at sunset Flores
bore S by E middle part squally heading S.E.
by the wind at 4 P.M. double reefed the top
sails latter part more moderate wind to the
ward rends Lat 37 54 Long 29 54
Wednesday first part light winds and squally
wind ranging from E to S 3 Ships in sight
at 5 P.M. double reefed the topsails latter
part more moderate wind all sail was S.E.
ends Lat 35 7 Long 30 7

Thursday first part fresh breezes from S.E. to
13 E.W. middle part tacked Ships at 6 P.M.
Boarder the dog run and jumped over board
the dog off all hands he had possession of
the dog about a quarter of an hour before he
took his exit later part pleasant employed
sailing 5 Ships in sight so ends
Friday Lat Sound

first part light wind from S.E. beating up
to Fayall at 5 P.M. it bore S.E. by E middle
and latter light wind and pleasant several
miles insight like our selves making very
little progress towards the port so ends

Saturday Lat 38 12 Long 39 47
15 first part light breezes from E.S.E. beating
to windward at sunset the land bore E distance by
estimation 12 miles at 7 the Captain went on board
the Ship Delta Capt. Penney off Green point
day out and bound to the Westerns after
stopping to Fayall. forenoon middle part pleasant
latter the same so ends Lat Sound

first part light air from the Eward at 4 P.M.
top sails and studding sail was becalmed off the
harbour about an hour at 8 came on board so ends
