first part pleasant with slight breeze S & E course
at night middle the same latter it being
pleasant we began to bundle our right whale
loam but at 11 o'clock it became squally and
we quieted after bundling 70 bundles

Tuesday first part rather squally with a fine breeze
17 E course N at night steered her off by
Palmerston Island being in the way middle
latter rather rainy course N employed in
Jobs sends

Wednesday first part rather rainy wind E
18 course N at 8 o'clock saw Palmerston
Island and hauled to the wind at night
it looked rather wild we steered off N
by the under cloast reefs rather rainy latter rainy
set the maintopsail maintopgallant sail and
job employed in or Jobs sends

Thursday first part abresh breeze S & E and rather
19 rainy course N at night took in the jib
double reefed the main topsail and hauled to
on the harbour tack latter heading S under
cloast reefs wind E S E and rainy sends

Friday first part high winds E S E and
20 rainy heading S repaired our hull
sets middle latter rather rainy employed
in or Jobs sends Sat Song

Saturday first part commenced with slight E and rainy
21 heading S E fitted the main brace block
straps and hauled down the bow boat Davy
and other jobs middle latter pleasant employed
in blacksmithing any other jobs sends
Sat 13:40 Song

Sunday July the 22nd 1838
first part pleasant with slight breeze S & E
heading S employed in or Jobs
middle latter pleasant took up the loam to
and began to bundle it sends Sat 20:25

Monday first part slight breeze S & E heading
23 S finished bundling the loam to
the amount of 202 bundles weighing 1470
lbs bleated the loam and meal forward and stowed
ed the loam down at middle latter light
air and cloudy sends Sat 20:45

Tuesday first part slight S & E heading S
24 the black smith at work middle and
latter pleasant stowed up the foreyard and put on
new quarter block straps and thro Jobs sends
Sat 21:38 Song not

Wednesday first part bundled 19 bundles of
25 damaged loam at 4 o'clock the wind rather
to the N E and squally course S
at 4 to night hauled the main topsail
double reefed the main and cloast reefs the
fore middle high winds and rainy
latter it increased to half a gale turned up
the boats sends

Thursday first part commenced with heavy
26 wind and rain from the N N W jibed
the foresail and foretop sail and cloast
reefed the main at 4 o'clock it moderated so
that we set the foresail course S
latter rather rainy hauled down the cutting
pennants began to strip them at
to raised a school of small whales and
at 11 lowered sends Sat 43:40
