August 24 1838

Friday 24. This 24 hours commenced with
 strong wind from the Southward lying at
 anchor off New Zealand light with all hands
 on board middle part thick weather latter
 part got under way and beat out at 11
 and 30 minutes discharged the Pilot off
 + Pegg.

Saturday 25. This 24 hours commenced with
 fresh Gale from South sailing to the E by
 S under easy sail middle part made
 sail and stood on our course in what
 direction I was hardly able to tell so how
 sick so we must give up all hopes tonight
 almost say of ever getting home again for
 only look at it 30 months. Oh! Oh Dear

 light wind from the South and clear weather
 middle part rainy latter part clear with
 fresh wind fair low sail starting yesterday
 this early Lat^o 39. 34 N

 strong wind at 2 P.M. wind changed to SW
 increasing at sunset hauled the main
 course and the top Galsail at 8 double
 upon the topsails at 10 passed the Mr. Lapsair
 latter part blowing strong from the W S W and
