55th Remarks Wednesday 24th of May 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the SE with
it pleasant the middle part but latter part squally
with rain employed in fitting the rigging at 5 P.M.
Set the fore top sail again and at 3 P.M. saw a sail
a steaming off to the N with all sail set and at 5
P.M. set the main top gallant sail with its guality
To End this 24 hours in the lat by obs 7-85 South
and Long by obs 30-33 West

56th Remarks Thursday 25th of May 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the
SE with strong squalls and some rain employed
in fitting the rigging at 2 P.M. look in the
main top gallant sail and at 6 P.M. set the fore and
main again with it quite pleasantly at 10 P.M.
Saw a fin back To End this 24 hours with frequent
rain squalls in the lat by obs 6 and Long by
obs 10-11 South and
Long 34-25 West

57th Remarks Friday 26th of May 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from
the SE with squalls and some rain employed in
fitting the rigging all day at 5 P.M. saw
a sail and at 5 A.M. saw a hump back and a
plenty of birds and several fish To End this
24 hours in the lat by obs 12-22 South and Long
by obs 2-24 C.S.R.

58th Remarks Saturday 27th of May 1848
This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the SE and squalls
with frequent rain squalls and strong winds in some of the rigging
employed in fitting the rigging at one P.M. saw a hump back
at 11 P.M. saw a hump back and caught some small fish. To End this 24 hours in
the lat by obs 13-14 S and Long by obs 33-34 West
and
Friday and Saturday = No. 100
