Remarks Saturday 28th of May 1848
This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the
S E with all sail set a Steering S W with some
squalls at 9 AM Saw some wind of whals supposed
to be sperm whal but they were so far off
that we could not tell what they was and we
did not see any small fish or birds
So ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 16-20 South
and Long by Chron 33-06 West or 90

Remarks Monday 29th of May 1848
This 24 hours with light winds from the S E
with its pleasant all day at 7 AM Saw fin backs
employed fitting the rigging and sail &c at 1 PM
An knot the fore top sail and mended it and
bent it again and sent it up again with the
winds light and baffle all day So ends this
24 hours in the Lat by obs 15-00 and Long by Chron
34-20 W or 71 S

Remarks Tuesday 30 of May 1848
This 24 hours begins with light winds from the
S and S W and from that to all around the
cup with pleasant weather at 7 AM break
sight water and provisions and employed in
fitting the rigging &c at 10 AM Saw humps
of whals So ends this 24 hours a Steering E and S
with the winds baffle all day in the Lat of by
obs and Long by Chron West from Greenwich in
log and in Lat 20-27 South 18-12 South
Long 34-20 West

Remarks Wednesday 31st of May 1848
This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the S W with all
sail set a Steering S W and by W with its pleasant all day
employed in fitting the rigging all day Saw some 8 or 9 fin
backs and a small head of plank with 2 spike holds in
it's bow ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 18-11 South
and Long by Chron 33-10 West from Green

A Whale Voyage To the Mozambique Channel 1848

June 1st 1848
Remarks Thursday 1st of June 1848
This 24 hours begins with light and pleasant winds from the S W
with all sail set a Steering S W from that to S W employed in
fitting the rigging and at 10 AM Saw fin backs employed in
making gunnet &c at ends this 24 hours in
the Lat by obs 19-44 and Long by Chron 34-14 West

Remarks Friday 2nd of June 1848
This 24 hours begins with light and moderate winds from
from the S E to E and N E with some rain squalls middle
part pleasant with all sail set a Steering S W and
S from that to S E and S E employed in making gunnet
yarn and in fitting the ship at 6 AM Saw some 6 or 7
fin backs all around the ship and at 10 AM a fish
caught one small fish So ends this 24 hours in the
Lat by obs 20-47 South and Long by Chron 33-58
West

Remarks Saturday 3rd of June 1848
This 24 hours with moderate winds from S E
to N E with rain squalls all day employed in the ship
at 1 PM Saw a sail and at 3 PM Saw fin
backs at 6 AM this morning began to stand west
headly & So ends this 24 hours with the top gallant
sails in with rain &c in the Lat by obs South
and Long by Chron West

Remarks Sunday 4th of June 1848
This 24 hours begins with moderate winds and rain
squalls from S E at 7 AM set all sail a Steering S
with the winds moderate and at 10 PM Saw fin backs
&c employed in the ship duty at 5 AM took the fore top
gallant sail and at 7 took in the main and put 2 reefs
in the top sails and took in the fore and main sail
So ends this 24 hours in the Lat 23-20 S and
Long 32-00 W Stopped on deck
at 10
