

Ship No 1 of Report of Samuel Lee master on

Remarks Monday 5<sup>th</sup> June 1848  
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the E S E with rain and short hail on the ship at 6 A M Get the main sail with it a blowing at 8 on bent the sails and went to work and took out one bolt at the same time saw for back and at 10 saw a black at the Cape town turned one reef eight of the main sheet and at 11 P M Get the topsails & set in the 2<sup>d</sup> hours in the lat by ab 11 and long by 11 27 30

Remarks Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> June 1848  
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the E S E and from that to S E with the topsails and main top gaff and sail Get at 3 P M Get for top line at 6 bent the jib and set up the rigging and at the same time saw 2 Sheeps and at 9 A M had all sails set with it pleasant employed in breaking eight the main hatches after water 11 saw 3 ship at 12 P M and saw for back at 4 got stowed off again so ends this 24 hours with blowing standing sail set a steering S E & in the lat by ab 11 and long by 11 30 30

Remarks Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> June 1848  
This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the N N W and W N W with it pleasant all day with all sail Get a steering S E with one sailer light employed in getting up and fitting the rigging at 4 P M saw a fin back & a plenty of work as get so ends this 24 hours with some rain squalls in the lat by ab 11 and long by 11 30 30

Whale Voyage to the Mozambique Channel 1848

Remarks Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1848  
This 24 begins with light sufflin winds from the W N W with frequent rain squalls all day at 2 P M went out to reef and took and at 9 on bent the main on topsail and mended it and set it again saw for back employed in ships duties a steering S E by E & from that to S E with the topsails shading sail set at 2 P M saw a back so ends this 24 hours S E 11 30 30

Remarks Friday 9<sup>th</sup> of June 1848  
This 24 hours begins with light sufflin winds from the S W and W N W with all sail like steering S E and S E by E with a sail in light at 11 P M put out the cover shading sail and went to work on old sails and saw for back so ends this 24 hours in the lat by ab 28-32 west by shore 25-31 West from G 11 30 30

Remarks Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> of June 1848  
This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the N W and W N W with it pleasant employed in making spungers and see 3 men employed on making covers and all such things a blowing to his duty saw for back & a steering S E by W with the winds light and old going well a running so ends this 24 in the lat by ab 29-31 South and long West from G 11 30 30

Remarks Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> of June 1848  
This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the N W and W N W with it pleasant all day Get and some light rain squalls but the middle part pleasant employed in ships duties &c saw for back so ends this 24 hours in the lat of S E 31 S and long by 11 30 30
