

Remarks On Board Barke Peascoe from

Monday July 27th 1846

First part strong breezes from WSW under Double reefs to Southward at 10 took in F. I. Sail wore Ship to SW watch Employed Boiling later more Moderate weather fair steered to NW by the wind under whole I. Sails but no whales in sight

Latitude Obs 35-13 Long A 3 P M 50-15

Tuesday 28th

All these 24 hours fresh breezes from WSW same squally first part steered to NW middle to SW & Southward later steered to Southward under whole I. Sails watch Employed Boiling saw a sail steering to East

Latitude Obs 35-26 Long A 11 P M 50-18

Wednesday 29th

First part fresh breezes from SW steered by the wind to SE at 4 fresh Boiling all the fat lean & blubber room Oil middle under short sail with boats crew watches later lively breezes from SE steered NE & South

Latitude Obs 35-37 Long A 10 A M 49-36

Thursday 30th

First part strong breezes from SW some squally by the wind to West at 2 saw beaches middle strong under short sail later fresh & squally steered to Westward by the wind

Latitude Obs 35-42 Long A 2-30 P M 50-30 Long 50-00-00

Friday 31st

All these 24 hours Moderate breezes from South fine weather first & middle steered to SE & ESE by the wind middle under Double reefs later to West under all sail. All hands Employed in Driving & Stowing Oil Down in the Blubber room

Latitude 35-40 Long A 10 A M 50-13 A 2 P M 50-28

Saturday 1st of August

All these 24 hours fine Moderate weather first part to SE by the wind saw a Dutch Barke steering NE later steered to SW by the wind under all sail To Ends & no whales Carpenter Sick & off Duty Blacks milk not much better Mr Kings under the operation of a Blister

Latitude Obs 35-21 Long A 12 P M merid 50-50

New Bedford towards Western Islands

Sunday August 2nd 1846

All these 24 hours Moderate breezes from South to SW fine weather first & middle steered to Eastward by the wind later to NW under all sail set #2 Mast Studingsail a Mopedite Brig to Windward steering to East

Latitude Obs 35-56 Long A 2 P M 51-02

Monday 3rd

First part Moderate breezes from SW fine clear weather at 2 steered SE middle fresh breezes flying Clouds under Double reefs course NE by N later strong breezes from SW flying Clouds course NW watch Employed Ships Duty

Latitude 37-43

To Ends & no whales 1 on a sp to East Long A 2 P M 50-42

Tuesday 4th

First part strong breezes from SW to WSW at 3 wind halled to WSW in a squall thick & rainy at 5 halled back again middle Moderate & unsteady from SW later light thick & rainy the most of the time at 8 A. M. halled the course to ENE first & middle course SE just before 11 the Sun broke out

Lat 39-24 Long 49-13-45

Wednesday 5th

Commences calm cleared off & a large ship hove in sight about 2 miles off at 4 a light breeze sprung up from NNE made all sail by the wind to East the Merchant Man steered WSW middle strong breezes I. G. sails fired later Moderate from NE all sail out & sail in sight Astern

Latitude 39-21

High sharp swell from the South Long 47-49

Thursday 6th

Commences calm at 7 P. M. a light breeze from SSE steered East at 9 a fine breeze from SW set #3 Mast Studingsail later light breezes from West steered East & Barke in sight to the Northward steering ESE Watch Employed setting up Lead Stays & repairing Mast Boat

Latitude Obs 39-40 Long A 3 P M 45-43 To Ends & no fish

Friday 7th

First part fine breezes from West clear & pleasant middle squally with heavy showers wind unsteady & baffling later light breezes fine clear weather all sail set first part sent up main I. G. Studingsails & set sails to Ends & no whales

Latitude 40-44 Long A 10 A M 43-47 watch Employed in sundry jobs
