

Wednesday
May 13th
1835
First part light breeze at
5 A.M. took anchor
and ran down to the light
and dropped the anchor
at 9 weighed anchor and
run out wind N.E. at 11
discharged the pilot at 12
at noon gagehead bearing East
Dist. 4 miles wind N.E.

Thursday
May 14th
1835
First part brisk breeze at
E.N.E. Steering S.W. at
4 P.M. Nomonsterd bearing
N.E. & E. Dist. 20 miles
Employed in hauling the anchors
&c Middle part moderate breeze
at E.S.E. Latter part the same
with rain Employed in fitting
Coats Ship Coors &c. Lat. act. 39° 26'
Long by do. 71° 45'

Friday
May 15th
1835
Commenced with fresh breeze
at S.E. & E. with rain at 3 P.M.
took in top G.L. Sails gill Spanker
and main course Middle part
Squally Latter part fresh breeze
at the North Ship heading
S.W. by S. Sighted one ship and
a boy all hands Employed in pre-
paring for taking whales thus
Ends Lat. in 38° 12'
Long in by Act. 72° 50'

Saturday
May 16th
1835
First part Strong Gales at North
with rain Shortened Sail at 2 P.M.
and kept too heading to the E.N.E.
middle and latter part moderate wind at
N.W. to W.S.W. at 10 A.M. Saw Clackfish lowered
and took one thus Ends Lat. in 37° 42' Long 72° 50'
