

12th Nothing Remarkable a head wind to go to sea

13th the wind southerly Nothing Remarkable

14 the Wind N.W. last up early and Put to sea when got off with Mouth of ground the wind started to West we stood out to sea.

15th the wind bears round to the North & so to East Run to the West S.W. off all Day spoke with Stephen Swain Lee a b.... D... O... h... o.. a b... & t.. i.. u..

16th Small wind and foggy Calm latter Part hanged our Sails on the Bank 24 fath. Water Paul Swain complains of a pain in his head & Back

Nothing Remarkable Paul Continues complain but in hopes it will pass off a day or two we continue our course to the southward to look for Whales saw in Backs & Tundry Vessels

18 4th Day of the week Left Ground off the Bank the Wind a SW. Lat. by 81° 37'. 48' Paul Continues to Be more poorly so concludes the Day

19th wind started to Northward get on the Bank in the latter Part Calm Caught 10 wrens Lat. by 81° 36'. 48' Paul Swain No better

20th in the Morning before start of the Day the Wind Blow fresh at E.N.E. in the latter Part started to N.N.E. Continue to Blow hard Paul Swain appears to be light headed & raises Blood so concludes this Day

21 Wind Notherly Rugged sea at Morn. Spoke with Jonathan Morel & Benjamin Burner Paul Continues out of his senses wind started to the N.N.W. Stood to g N.E. Lat. by 81° 33'. 45'

22nd Spoke with Barzilla Luce Bound out fore Part Wind North latter P.M. Westerly Paul very poorly Kaiser Blood Slept none last night at sunset carried away to Grof Neck of our shore understand by some of our hands that of 15th Paul Received a bad blow on the back of his head
