Nothing Remarkable Paul continues complain but in hopes it will pass off at Day or two we continue our course to the South ward to Look for Whales saw in Back &undry Vessels

18<sup>th</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> Day of the week Left Ground off the Bank the Wind a SW. Lat. by 013 37-40 Paul continues to be more poorly so concludes the Day

19<sup>th</sup> wind started to Northward got on the Bank. in the latter part Calm caught 1000000 Lat. by 013 36-48 Paul Swain no better

20<sup>th</sup> in the Morning & fore part of the Day the Wind blew fresh at E. N. E. in the latter part started to S. N. E. continues to blow hard Paul Swain appears to be light headed & raises Blood so concludes this Day

21<sup>st</sup> Wind Northerly. Rugged Sea at 11 o'clock spoke with Jonathan Mores & Benjamin Bunker Paul continues out of his senses wind started to the N. N. W. stood to S. N. E. Lat. by 013 35-45

22<sup>nd</sup> spoke with Barzilla Luce Bound out fore part Wind North latter part Westerly Paul very poorly raises Blood slept none last night at sunset Carried away by Gull sick of our Boon understood by some of our hands that 9 15<sup>th</sup> Paul received a bad blow on the back of his head
