Remarks on Board Ship Parrotta Capt. Harding  
from New Bedford bound to the w. Pacific and Arctic Ocean  
on a whaling Voyage

Tuesday December 14<sup>th</sup> 1852

A 104<sup>th</sup> o'clock A.M. we weighed anchor and made sail  
to a strong breeze from the w. W. and shaped our course to  
the south leaving the home of youth with our friends and  
family. In doing this I sacrifice my feelings, the pleasure  
of my friends, my home, my wife, and my little ones, feeling  
it a duty to consult their interest rather than my feelings  
swayed by this mighty impulse I tore myself from them  
overcome every obstacle break down every barrier and dash  
away every tear that shall arise through human weakness  
and even stave death in the fare to accomplish this great  
object, determined to forget all dangers, all hardships  
and all privations not trusting in my own strength no,  
for that would be weakness that could not be tolerated but  
I will put my trust in Him who has said (I will not  
 forsake you) and if I live to get home it will be found that

Garrett Banriper or Jersey Andrew J. Smith black slave  
w. J. and Wm. Sharp Steerage Boy about 15 years of age Ohio  
and one dog and a small pig made up our compliment  
I have found there is quite a number of hogs and dogs on board  
and wish they had 4 legs

I am now one year out and I have been able to learn the names and  
ranks of the crew. First Mate Cyrus Taber 2<sup>nd</sup> Mate  
Daniel Worth belongs to the Vineyard 3<sup>rd</sup> Mate Alexander March  
or w. B. 4<sup>th</sup> Mate Wm. Lambert Vineyard. Steward John  
Clark w. J., Cabin boy Robert Brown w. B. Boatmen  
Thomas Rakeman w. Marshfield Charles Pierce Dartmouth  
and Ned Gannon Eng. Carpenter Eveline R. Childs Com.  
sper H. Haleaphill w. B. now the foremost hands  
Matthew Cornings alias Shorty Port. Main w. Y. Joseph G.  
Charles Phillips ton Major Wm. Brown Lancaster P. A.  
Charles Wright Hartford Com calls himself a jigger Henry  
was born a slave in Maryland Henry Rodriguez Dominguez
