Remarks on board Bank Sea Fox Monday Aug 28<sup>th</sup>  
latter part these 24 hours light winds from the  
S.E. and pleasant weather at 8<sup>th</sup> m left the  
Wharf in tow of the Steam tug Spring at 8<sup>th</sup>  
made sail bound to sea at 10<sup>th</sup> discharged the  
pilot steering S.W. at 11<sup>th</sup> passed the Light  
boat steering S.W. by the sound

Tuesday August the 31<sup>st</sup>  
begins with moderate gales from the S.E. steering  
by the wind to the S.W. middle and latter parts  
strong gales from the East steering to the S.W.  
under sail reefed topsails saw whelp steering  
saw black fish empty in fishing the boats

Lat 37-10 Long 70-10  
Wednesday August the 4<sup>th</sup>  
begins with brisk gales from the S.E. and rugged  
weather steering to the south by the wind middle  
and latter parts wind from the S.W. at 11<sup>th</sup>  
m tacked to the East saw two seals

Lat 37-29 Long 71-10  
Thursday the 5<sup>th</sup>  
begins with brisk gales from the S.E. and  
weather steering to the Eastward by the wind middle  
part much the same latter part moderate  
gales from the S.W. steering E by S saw two  
seals

Lat 37-55 Long 71-31  
Friday the 6<sup>th</sup>  
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the South  
and squally weather steering to the S.E. employed  
in fishing the boats

Lat 37-38 Long 71-20  
Saturday the 7<sup>th</sup>  
begins with brisk gales from the S.W. and  
rugged middle part squally with much  
thunder and lightning and rain latter  
more pleasant
