Monday Nov 4<sup>th</sup> 1861 at 9 A.M. Sailed from the Wharf with a fine Westerly wind, the Wind carrying to the S.W. The Bark carrying all Sail beating out of the Bay.

Tuesday Nov 5<sup>th</sup> Comes in with strong breeze from N.W. the Bark beating out of the Bay at 3 P.M. Weathered the Light Boat, the Pilot left us. Middle and latter part steering S by W. at noon Lat 39.40 N Long 69.00 W

Wednesday Nov 6<sup>th</sup> These twenty four hours fine weather and moderate breeze from the S.W. steering S. E. by E. Middle and latter part much the same several vessels in sight Lat 39.26 N Long 68.30

Thursday Nov 7<sup>th</sup> This day Comes in with fine weather and moderate winds from the N.W. the Bark steering S. E. by E. Middle and latter part much the same saw nothing of importance Lat 38.30 N Long 65.59

Saturday Nov 9<sup>th</sup> This day Comes in with fine weather and moderate winds from the Westward the Bark steering to the S. E. Employed breaking out and filling Boats Lat 35.12 N Long 59.42 W
