Tuesday Jan 24

Came with fresh gales from NNE heading N W with double reef topsails set at 2 PM struck in to the gulf at night weather dark and rainy last part light and from SE and pleasant weather saw a ship steering S W

Lat 37-16 Long 72-15
By Lunar Ob 71-57

Saturday Jan 25

Came with light air from SE and pleasant sun laid in night middle light bore from the Northward last part light air from SE and pleasant

Lat 38-06 Long 72-11
By Lunar Ob 71-35

Sunday Jan 26

pleasant breeze from south steering N W
Thus the same got the chains up and bent them

Lat 40-12 Long 72-45

Monday Jan 27

Came with moderate breeze from S W steering North at 3 PM spoke pilot boat Washington New York informed me that I was 45 miles from Montauk

Ship Cleopatra New London Bound on
A Whaling voyage sailed July 1st 1851

Tuesday July 1

at 7 AM took Propeller Oregan and were out were the rain in the fog came to anchor

Wednesday July 2

Began with calm foggy weather in the night cleared off with light breeze from N W at 4 AM got under way and went to sea at 9 AM left the pilot stowed the anchors and reeved the chains below Montague point bearing S W dist 11 miles

Lat 41-60 Long 73-35

Thursday July 3

Came with light breeze from south at 4 PM Montague light bore N W dist 13 miles from which I take my departure General Levert & Canalic went to sea middle and last part weather the same

Thus Ends
Lat 41-26 Long 73-40

Friday July 4

Came with light breeze from south clear with fogginess by 8 middle wind SE and raining took ship at 4 PM were round headed to the eastward number of ships in sight but just clear weather wind south employed fitting the sails

Thus Ends
Lat 40-21 Long 68-15

Saturday July 5

Came with pleasant breeze from S W steering by 8 saw a steam ship bound to the westward threw the night long thunder and light

Thus Ends
Lat 39-58 Long 65-25
