

Journal of A. P. Rogers at sea on  
Brig John of the Portland Regt. 1844

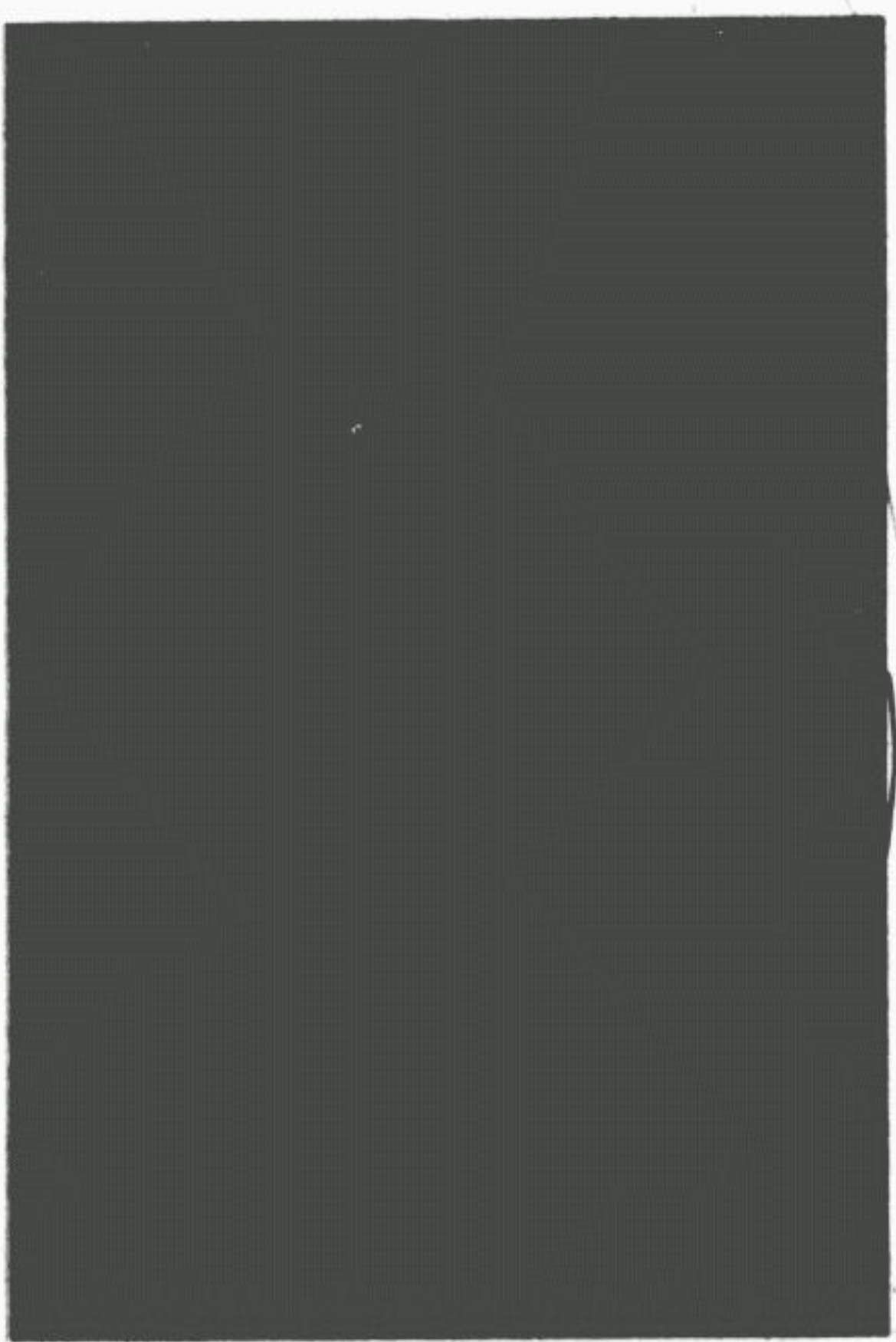
Friday May 4<sup>th</sup> 1844 at 2 o'clock  
Anchored in 9 fathoms water with a fine  
sea from the N. at 11 with a light breeze  
at 12 calm at 2 a light breeze from the  
N. standing on the main all hands  
employed ships duty so under these 2 hours

Saturday May 5<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours commences with a light  
breeze from the N. at 6 at 11 a light breeze  
bearing off East 8 miles middle part  
strong breeze from the N. at 11 latter part  
raining with thunder so under these 24 hours

Sunday May 6<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours commences with a light breeze  
from the N. standing off at 11 at 11 a light breeze  
bearing off East 8 miles so under these 24 hours

Monday May 7<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours commences with a strong  
breeze from the N. standing off at 11  
at 5 at 11 spoke the bark little over 100  
miles home saw several other sails middle  
part strong breeze from the N. at 11  
noon at 11 in main sail to gain latter part  
wind at 11 fine weather at 2 at 11  
of blackbirds; but did not hear the boat all  
employed in ships duty so under these 24 hours

Tuesday May 8<sup>th</sup>  
First part calm saw a school of blackfish  
heard the boat hit without seeing at 11  
and at 11 saw several middle part strong  
wind at 6 at 11 saw fish these 24 hours  
with fine wind and rain



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
