This day commences fine weather light winds
and several small fish such as dolphins & at
1 P.M. saw porpoises at 7 P.M. took in sail
these 24 hours steering N.W. to under these

Monday the 29

Fine weather, saw several seals, and some
drift stuff but no whales in sight, last
part fine weather so under these 24 hours

Thursday the 25

These 24 hours commences with a
light breeze from the N.W. steering to
the N. and saw several seals but
no whale last part, strong winds and
cloudy so under these 24 hours

Wednesday the 24

First part strong breeze from the N.W. steering
to the N. and saw one seal in sight
middle and last part steering N.W. to
so under these 24 hours

Thursday the 25

These 24 hours commences with a strong
wind from the N.W. steering to the N. but
2 hours too under sail at 1 P.M. took in
sail and at 2 P.M. most of sail, heading to
the N. and W. last part light wind fine
weather so under these 24 hours

Friday the 26

These 24 hours commences with light breeze
steering to the N. and W. at 4 P.M. saw
a seal at 9 P.M. saw fish from 10 P.M. to
for the first of the day saw several seals
at 10 P.M. saw seals at 11 P.M. and under these 24 hours

Thursday June the 1 1824

These 24 hours fine weather saw a school of
porpoises several seals in sight these 24 hours
gone and no whales

Monday the 2

Fine weather with a light breeze
from the N. and W. at 2 P.M. saw
white water supposed to be Jumpers
and saw a school of porpoises and seals
so under these 24 hours

Monday the 3

Light winds and ^{pleasant} weather saw several
seals at 2 P.M. saw some small fish
beginning to get at 4 P.M. saw a school
of Black fish and killers beyond the boat
without success so under these 24 hours

Thursday the 6

These 24 hours commences with fine weather
under the main sail steering N.W. to
one seal in sight so under these 24 hours

Wednesday the 5

These 24 hours commences with a light
wind fine weather saw several seals at
four P.M. saw some kind fish but
did not know what they were supposed
them to be Jumpers so under these 24 hours

Thursday the 6

These 24 hours commences with ^{light} fine weather
at 2 P.M. saw a school of whales heard and
fastened to one the ship, went over out to the
windward, took that whale along side and him in
by 4 P.M. last part fine weather so under these 24 hours
