

Remarks On Board of Ship Bart. Gosnell
To her voige on Tortoise on June 17th 1866
under command of Captain Pilate

Tuesday The 19th

At 10 A.M. we weigh our anchors from the
New Bedford harbor and set sail with S.W.
wind: to end, in biting out

Wednesday The 20th

The first part of these twenty four hours
we been in plain in biting out at in less
pace with 4 mi. barke and America length
at 11 P.M. the pilot went on shore then we
let head our anchors and stand to sea at
Lancann normans land was bearing S.E.
and we heading S. by E. under all sail
mid and latter part the same bearing

Lat by obs 39:45 N
Long by do 67:56 West

Thursday The 21st

The first part of this
twenty four hours began with moderate
wind from S.W. and we steering S. by E.
under all sail: in plain in rigging the
boats and other things duty saw a sail sailing
to the eastward mid and latter part moderate
windy and fine weather saw two sails
one steering to the eastward and the other
to the westward to end

Long by do 67:11 W
