June 10th
Wednesday 10th

Light breeze from SW with clear weather
steering by the wind on the starboard tack
three sail in sight

Thursday 11th

Lat 37 17 N
Long 58 36 W

Light breeze from the south with pleasant
weather steering by the wind on the starboard
tack this afternoon all hands employed in
tacking up spars four sail in sight
shortened sail at sundown

Friday 12th

Lat 37 43 S
Long

Strong breeze from the SE steering
by the wind saw a sulphur bottom this afternoon
three sails in sight

Saturday 13th

Lat 38 07 N
Long 52 15 W

Strong breeze from the SE steering
nothing of note doing board ship three
sail in sight

Sunday 14th

Lat 38 13 N
Long 47 46 W

Strong breeze from the SE steering
the Capt distributed on books and papers
this morning to the men that was sent
out by the city mistress one sail in sight

Monday 15th

Lat 38 04 N
Long 44 28 W

Light breeze from SW steering
saw a finback one sail in sight practice
the men in furling sail towards night so
ends this day

Light breeze from SW steering by the
wind heading NW in squally weather
M^p and L^o stronger breeze double
reefed at sunset one sail in sight

and clear tacked ship at noon
saw porpoises

Sunday June 30th

Moderate breeze from NW with squalls
of rain heading SW M^p clear L^o light
breeze from SW steering by the wind
boats to practice the crew nothing in sight

Light breeze from SW but heavy weather
M^p strong breeze steering by the wind
breeze with squalls of rain saw porpoises
one sail in sight luffed to the wind and
shortened sail at sunset

Weak breeze from SW with frequent
squalls of rain M^p and L^o the same
saw porpoises at sundown took in
the foretop sail and foregait fuffed to
the wind on the starboard tack
