Tuesday July 16th - 1839

Remarks on board ship Friend of Green
Port Isaac Mase Master Bound on a
Whaler voyage to the South Atlantic
and the whaler with 3 crews all hands
went on board and got under way
the wind S W and led advice to our
friends and acquaintances. At 12 o'clock
Montague light bore N W 7 miles
Distance so ends this day with light
winds from the S W

Wednesday 17th

This day commenced with light winds
from the S W. The Roanoke 2 points
of our sea bow saw several sloops
and schooners &c. the day ends with
fine weather steering S

Thursday 18th

All this day fine weather at 8 P.M.
Chase boat crews saw 1 ship steering
E at 10 A.M. saw a Brig steering
on the wind at 6 P.M. saw a whaler
but not near, the wind W W
steering S W

Friday 19th

All this day light winds and pleasant
weather saw nothing but some porpoises
The wind West steering S in company
with the Roanoke Lat by Obs 37.05
Course S. by E. Long 67.38

Saturday 20th

All this day pleasant with a light breeze from
the W steering S W in company with the
Roanoke At 5 P.M. saw some Grampings
Sailed this day Lat 38.22 Long 67.4
