

Ship *Jun* Brothers New Bedford
Edward Nichols, Master. Arrived from N. B.
May 22nd 1850 (1851) bound to the Pacific Ocean.

Friday May 23rd Sea. act: 10th. No 1
got underway from the Anchorage the wind
blowing a strong breeze from the South. 10th
Head. Camp. in. beating out. The log at
4 1/2 P.M. the Pilot left the ship. Midst
Part. thick & gradually took in top gallant
sails at 10 P.M. Starboard lightening attended
with heavy showers of rain. Took in one
top. carrying a fore of sail to make the
ship. Put by the same. Lat. 41. 10
Long 71. 07

Saturday 24th No 2
begin with mod. moderate wind from the
N.W. steering by the wind to the S.W. &
N.W. by N. by W. in sight at 4 P.M.
Shook & New York Pilot. Mid Part.
The wind shifted to N.W. blowing a strong
breeze. Lat. in strong breeze from N.W. &
sea a shower of black fish going quick to the
windward. Lat. 39. 07
Long 69. 27 W

Sunday 25th No 3
begin with fresh breeze from N.W. to S.W. Camp
in. fitting boats & getting ready for Whaling
at 5 P.M. started at 6 by N. Mid Part. fresh
breeze from east. Lat. Part. the same. sea
making bars & 3 sail. Lat. 37. 00 W
Long 67. 59 W

Monday 26th No 4
fresh breeze from the Eastward at 1 P.M. tacked
to the N.W. Mid Part. strong wind. Lat. Part.
light wind from S.W. & altered by the wind
to the N.W. employed in fitting rigging
which we find very much out of order.
Lat. 38. 08 W Long 67. 03 W
