Sunday June 15th 1824

Commenced with calm & clear weather
sea proposed & sails Mid part & Latter
light air from the South steered S.W. at 9
AM saw school of small sperm whales going
to the S.W. at 10 AM saw 2 boats in chase
& struck 5

~~Monday June 16th~~ 1825
begins with light wind from S.W. at 2 PM
took 4 whales along side 2 boats looking for
the 5th at 3 PM took up the boats supposed
the whale to have sunk with a Mass. in
harm both in 2 whales & long by 2 Mid &
Latter part of fresh breeze at 4 PM finished
killing. Emp. in clearing away heads
Lat. 32.25 N
Long 49.48 W

Tuesday June 17th 1826
Commenced with a fresh breeze from the South
at by the wind to the S.W. saw 1 whale reefed top sails
at 1 PM began to boil. Mid & Latter part to
same. one sail insight
Lat. 31.58 N
Long 48.31 W

Wednesday June 18th 1827
begins with a moderate breeze from the South
at by the wind to the S.W. Emp. in boiling
Spoke a French brig bound to the West Indies
part letters to the Mid & Latter part light
wind at 1 PM took to the S.W. at 9 AM
Spoke the ship Milton of N Bedford 48 Months
2200 Sp.
Lat. 32.08 N
Long 48.09 W

Cruising for Sperm Oil June 1821

Thursday June 19th 1828
These 24 hours begins with light wind from
S.W. at 1 PM took to the S.W. at 7 PM finished
boiling Mid part Latter light wind Emp.
in boiling Oil
Lat. 31.48 N
Long 47.09 W

Friday June 20th 1829
begins with light wind from S.W. at 4 PM
part on lower ship Milton 14 bars of Sperm
Oil containing 55 lbs Mid part Moderate
Latter a fresh breeze & showers of rain at
11 AM took to the South
Lat.
Long

Saturday June 21th 1830
begins with a fresh breeze from S.W. & cloudy
at by the wind to the South at 7 PM reefed the
top sails Mid & Latter part light wind from
S.W. at by the wind to the Westward
Lat. 31.02 N
Long 48.14 W

Sunday June 22th 1831
Commenced with light wind from S.W. at by the
wind to the Westward spoke the brig the Diana
of New York bound to New York part letters
unpacked Mid & Latter part light wind
Lat. 30.39 N
Long 50.09

Monday June 23th 1832
begins with light air from the S.W. at by
the wind to the N Mid & Latter part the same
Spoke the sea box of the ship part 6 Mackerel
cham.

Tuesday June 24th 1833
These 24 hours light air from the S.W. &
sea squid. Mid part calm. Latter part light
wind from S.W. at by the wind to the S.W.
Lat. 31.34 N
Long by sea 49.38 W
Longitude 49.46
