

Bark Valparaiso

Friday September 12th 1845

Fore part strong winds from SE fine weather, crossing off the island of Terceira heading to the south by the wind the watch employed about various jobs at sunset double reefed mid and latter part moderate and fine weather one ship in sight and the land 10 miles

Saturday Sept 13th 1845

Fore part light airs from NW off the east side the island nothing in sight of the whale kind at night in topgallant sails at daylight put all sail stowed in to the one mile off tacked off two ships in sight

Sunday Sept 14th 1845

commenced light weather some foggy at night in light sails tacked in for Terceira nothing in sight middle calm latter light winds and variable one ship in sight heading south do ends

Monday Sept 15th 1845

Fore part light airs from west heading in for Terceira at 3 PM saw blackfish toward caught one at night in light sails and heading south 10 miles dist latter part strong winds from SW double reefed at 1 - stowed in to the SE part of the island 2 ships in sight do ends
