

Sunday Dec 22<sup>nd</sup> commences with light winds and calms middle part the same latter part the same the ship in sight proved to be the Washington of New Bedford capt  
Lat 29, 41 Holding 20 days of port went onboard again

Monday Dec 23<sup>rd</sup> commences with light winds and fine  
clear weather middle the same latter part rained a while and  
by 6 rain of perlim and proved to be a burrhead  
Lat 28, 47 all hands Employed in ships duty so ends this day

Tuesday Dec 24<sup>th</sup> commences with fine breezes from the westward  
S by E the ship Washington in sight at 5<sup>th</sup> 1/2 all sail set  
Lat 27, 51 wind on the quarter going 6 not latter part raised a  
son 27 sail to the inward bearing so ends this day

Wednesday Dec 25<sup>th</sup> commences with fresh breezes from the South E  
Lat 24, 25 the middle part the same but the S, S, and sent the yard all  
so ends these 24 hours

Thursday Dec 26<sup>th</sup> commences with light winds from the  
S by E East part Middle part set the Main Sail latter  
Lat part took in the S, S, and S, S, so ends this day

Friday Dec 27<sup>th</sup> commences with light winds from the  
S by E Eastward set the Main Sail top, Middle and  
Lat or part Moderate both watches Employed  
in ships duty so ends these 24 hours

Saturday Dec 28<sup>th</sup> commences with fine breezes from  
S by E Eastward Middle and latter part the same  
Lat all sail set going 6 knots S by E, so ends this day

Sunday Dec 29<sup>th</sup> commences with stiff breezes from  
S by E the Eastward took in fore and top, S, S, S, S  
Lat and S, S, S, S, standing by and hauld  
son 29 aback the M, S, were still in the middle watch  
made the land at 6 in the morning top of and  
made sail left the inward windward side of the  
Lat 24 ward 3 lanes left of the land at 2 o'clock S by E  
son 31 so ends this day

Monday the 30<sup>th</sup> commences with fine breezes from  
the South E the ship in sight at 12, 30  
Lat 29, 41 the first and second masts went ashore at 12 and  
got recruits orange Annan was coasts spoke the  
son 31 large Marcellus capt Smith, 55 days from port  
so ends these twenty four hours

Tuesday the 31<sup>st</sup> commences with light breezes the boat  
S by W came off at 5 o'clock and squared the yards  
Lat and made sail steard S by W, latter part on tent  
the S by W and mended it all hands employed in  
ships duty so ends this day

Wednesday Jan the 1<sup>st</sup> commences with fine breezes from  
S by W the S, E, fore part bent the S by W and furled it  
Lat 18, 55 Middle and latter part the same all hands  
son 23, 42 Employed in riving up an old sail so ends

Thursday Jan the 2<sup>nd</sup> commences with favorable breezes  
S by W from the East and East fore part set up the head  
Lat 17, 54 stays (lost the Monkey overboard at 6 o'clock) latter part  
son 23, 12 light breezes and fine weather so ends this day

Friday Jan the 3<sup>rd</sup> commences with light breezes from the  
Eastward all hands employed in fitting the  
Lat 17, 24 head rising and mack blocks raised sperm  
son 23, 16 whales and black fish at 4 1/2 M, board all 4 boats and  
the Starboard boat first and dived from a whale  
the waist boat got a black fish and brought him  
a board chard him away, whistled up the boat  
and squared the yards, the latter part bent  
and mended the S by W, so ends this day

Saturday January the 4<sup>th</sup> commences with light breezes  
from the E all hands Employed in fitting the  
Lat 16, 55 head rising, no braces latter part started the  
son 23, 37 works No sail out the black fish wind light  
and from the westward so ends this day
