Remarks of a Voyage

Remarks On Board Ship Benj. Tucker
 On a Voyage Right Whaling & Laid Oct 22nd
 1855. Barber Master

Sunday Oct 23rd 1855

First part of this 24 hours a fresh gale from the N.W. at 8 P.M. took the anchor and went to sea at 6 P.M. the Pilot left the ship under double reefed topsails

Middle part more moderate turned out the reefs and set the maintopgallant sail steering S.E. at work in stowing the anchors set the fly gill

Saturday 24th

First part of this 24 hours fresh gale from S.W. took in maintopgallant sail and fly gill and Mizen topsail reefed the fore and maintopsails steering S by S Middle the same took in the main sail and foretopsail the wind S.W. at 4 P.M. carried away the Mast Boat Latter part much the same set the fore topsail a very heavy sea on

Sunday 25th

First part of this 24 hours a fresh gale from the N.W. and a heavy sea on Middle the same steering S.E. Latter part more moderate set the mainsail and turned the reefs out of the foretopsail

Lat 38.42 N

Monday 26th

First part of this 24 hours a fresh breeze from N.W. and a very swell set the gill Middle part more moderate set the fly gill and mizen topsail

Latter part a breeze on double reefed the fore and mizen topsails
