

Remarks made on board Bark. Wm. Baylies

Sept. 20th 1856. No Observation

Let mine took our departure from New Bedford with a strong N.W. wind. At eleven pilot left us with all on board wishing to make a prosperous voyage.

Tuesday, Sept. 21, 1856. Lat. 38. 23. Long. 65. 34.

P.M. moderate winds at three bands in sight bearing N.E. distant fifteen miles. Sun set in land. Middle part wind moderating and working to the Eastward. Latter part employed getting boats ready.

Wednesday, Sept. 22, 1856. Lat. 38. 40. Long. 66. 28

P.M. wind North and moderate. Sun set steering S.S.E. Nothing in sight. Middle and latter light winds. Employed all hands getting boats ready.

Thursday, Sept. 23, 1856. Lat. 39. 37. Long. 67. 07

P.M. Breeze in with light winds. Employed generally. Sun set steering S.S.E. all sail set. Middle part strong winds and working to the Eastward. Latter part wind moderating. Employed getting boats ready.

Friday, Sept. 24, 1856. Lat. 37. 05. Long. 63. 59

P.M. Employed at the main. A number of sails in sight. Sun set wind the same. Middle and latter part light winds. Employed at Ship's duty. Getting shrouse gear aloft. One sail in sight.
